Principal Report on Literacy and Technology

Rocky View School chosen as pilot school for Literacy and Numeracy alignment. This is mostly for K – 3 but higher grades also benefitting.

A technology update will be coming to the school. Some decisions will have to be made on how to forward with adding grade 6 to the school next year.

Suggestions were to have students bring their own laptops.

We need accountability for students and families as a lot of technology is damaged by students

Perhaps look at a leasing program from a third party. Parents would be responsible for technology and lease agreement. School will look into this possibility.

Trustees have received the prelims on the budget for September.

It looks like it will be a status quo budget.
Currently we have the provincial weighted movement average
We may get a supplement enrollment grant for extra students enrolled.

There is full construction funding for a new High school in South Winds. Opening for 2030. There was a question on

why it takes so long to build a school. We all have to take into consideration labour and supplies.

Also funding for Davison Landing School in Chestermere.

East south Airdrie needs a school.. We are awaiting design funding to be able to proceed.

The Horseshoe school was opened in September. A special ceremony is upcoming to celebrate its opening.

Rocky School Division has selected its new Superintendent. It is Ryan Reid. He has been on staff for a number of years. He will now spend a few months with the current superintendent to get immersed in his upcoming position.

Question about support staff going on strike like other school divisions. We were informed by Todd that Rocky View School Division support staff are not in a union so there will not be a strike.
